Directions

Entry to the Historic Dockyard, in which the Royal Naval Museum is located, will be available for those arriving on foot from 1000hr via the Victory Gate located by HMS Warrior at the corner of Queen street and the Hard.

The Royal Naval Museum is located within Portsmouth Historic Dockyard, a five-minute walk (approximately 130 metres) from the Portsmouth Historic Dockyard Visitor centre. The Historic Dockyard is less than 5 miles from Junction 12 of the M27. Follow the brown Historic Waterfront signs from the M275 into Portsmouth. The postcode for satellite navigation devices is PO1 3LA.

We prefer that entry to the Dockyard by car is reserved for those with limited mobility and that others should park in the sign posted car park just outside the Dockyard. Access to to the Dockyard by car is via Unicorn Gate; those wishing to use this facility must give their name and car registration to the Treasurer when making their application to attend. Payment at the car park outside is made before driving away and change is given so there is no need to try and estimate the parking duration.
